WELCOME NEW TRUSTEE STAN BORYS

Stan Borys was sworn in as a Village Trustee at the May 28 Village Board meeting. He is completing the remaining term of former Trustee Angie Underwood who is now serving as Village President.



Stan has been a resident of Long Grove since he retired in 2008.

During his professional career, he worked extensively in the energy and defense industries, primarily focused on the development, protection and commercialization of novel technologies. His positions included Director of the Industrial Technology Development Center at Argonne National Laboratory, Chief Operating Officer and Executive Vice President of the Gas Technology Institute, and most recently Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of International Titanium Powder LLC. His education includes a B.S. in Mechanical Engineering from Bradley University, M.S. in Theoretical and Applied Mechanics from University of Illinois in Champaign, and an M.S. in Business Administration with concentrations in economics and corporate finance from the University of Chicago.

Since his retirement, Stan has stayed active in motorcycling as an instructor for the Motorcycle Safety Foundation and for Harley Davidson. He is also the Head Road Captain for the Palatine HOG Chapter and a Ride Captain for the Illinois Patriot Guard Riders. In 2011, Stan captured a second-place finish in his age group at the Bataan Death March Memorial Marathon at White Sands in New Mexico.

TICKS - WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Tick season in Lake County is in full force. These tiny arachnids, similar to a spider or mite, can infect and cause serious illness to humans, pets and wildlife.

There are two species of ticks in Lake County - the deer tick, known to carry Lyme disease; and the wood tick (also called American dog tick), the most common tick in Illinois, which carries such diseases as Rocky Mountain spotted fever.



To reduce the risk of exposure to ticks, there are several precautions one can take. Wear light-colored clothing - long-sleeved shirts, long trousers, boots or sturdy shoes and a head covering are recommended. Tuck pant cuffs into socks and shirt tails into pants. Apply an insect repellent containing DEET to clothing.

Ticks are most commonly found near wooded areas and tall grasses. They wait on tall vegetation and grasp onto any large object that passes by. When hiking at a forest preserve, stay on the trails and walk in the center of the trails so plants do not brush against you. Keep lawns and grass around play equipment trimmed short.

Before you enter your car and after you come indoors, check clothing thoroughly for ticks. Remove any ticks found on clothing and dispose of them. Place clothing in a dryer on high heat for one hour to kill ticks. Take a shower and check entire body for ticks.

If you find a tick attached to your body, remove it immediately by using a tweezers and grasping near its head; pull upward with slow, even pressure. Once the tick is removed, disinfect the bite site and wash your hands with soap and water. Make a note of the date you removed the tick and save it for identification in case you become ill. Place the tick in a plastic bag and put it in the freezer.

Any signs or symptoms of tick-borne disease will occur from 10 to 55 days following a tick bit. Seek medical help if a "bull's-eye" rash or lesion appears accompanied by fever, fatigue, headache, muscle aches, and/or joint aches.
