AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS 3-2-4 AND 3-2-16 OF THE LONG GROVE VILLAGE CODE REGARDING LIQUOR LICENSES

WHEREAS, the overuse of alcohol may result in adverse outcomes for those who imbibe, their families, those with whom they interact, and society in general; and

WHEREAS, persons licensed to sell alcoholic beverages therefore have a special responsibility to protect the public health, safety, and welfare by ensuring that such sales occur in conformity with all applicable laws, regulations, and standards; and

WHEREAS, one measure of whether a licensee or potential licensee can meet the responsibilities of protecting the public health, safety, and welfare is to evaluate whether such person complies with the law; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees have determined that it is in the best interests of the Village and its residents to amend the liquor control regulations contained in Title 3, Chapter 2 of the Long Grove Village Code ("Village Code") as set forth in this Ordinance;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF LONG GROVE, COUNTY OF LAKE, STATE OF ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE. Recitals. The foregoing recitals are incorporated into this Ordinance as the findings of the President and Board of Trustees.

<u>SECTION TWO.</u> <u>Amendment to Section 3-2-4.</u> Section 3-2-4, titled "Restriction of Licenses," of Chapter 2, titled "Liquor Control Regulations," of Title 3, titled "Business Regulations," of the Village Code is hereby amended in part and shall hereafter be and read as follows:

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3-2-4 RESTRICTION OF LICENSES

No such license shall be issued to:

* * *

- (R) A person who, in the conduct of the business to be operated under the requested license or upon the premises thereof, is in violation of any valid ordinance or resolution enacted by the Village Board or any State or federal law.
- (S) A person who is delinquent in the payment of any tax, fee, fine, or penalty due and owing to the Village.

SECTION THREE. Amendment to Section 3-2-16. Section 3-2-16, titled "Revocation of License," of Chapter 2, titled "Liquor Control Regulations," of Title 3, titled "Business Regulations," of the Village Code is hereby amended in part and shall hereafter be and read as follows:

3-2-16 REVOCATION OR SUSPENSION OF LICENSE

The Village President may suspend or revoke any license issued hereunder for:

(i) any violation of any provision of this chapter or any other valid ordinance or resolution enacted by the Village Board or any State or federal law pertaining to the conduct of the licensed business or operations on the licensed premises; or for any violation of any State law pertaining to the sale of alcoholic liquors; (ii) any violation of any applicable rule or regulation established by the local liquor control commissioner or the State liquor control commission; (iii) any condition of the local liquor commissioner associated with the license in question; (iv) any circumstance for which the licensee would not be qualified to receive a license; or (v) delinquency in the payment of any tax, fee, fine, or penalty due and owing to the Village. The licensee shall be given notice and an opportunity for a hearing in the manner required by the Illinois Liquor Control Act of 1934, as amended, in connection with any suspension or revocation of a license issued hereunder or imposition of any fines for violations of this chapter.
